*B*uilt as a living memorial to honour the fallen soldiers from World War II – the Red Cross War Memorial Children’s Hospital was created as a special place of healing for children.




The Children’s Hospital Trust invites you to our Day of Remembrance ceremony

REMEMBRANCE DAY NOVEMBER 11th 2015

It was at 11o'clock
on the 11th day of the 11th month 1918
when armistice was signed ending the
“War to end all Wars”

Unfortunately wars didn’t end and they continue to rage across the world killing, injuring and maiming countless numbers of men, women and children.

Returning soldiers to Cape Town, after World War II, felt the need to build a monument to honour their comrades that had fallen in the field of battle. They didn’t want an inanimate object but a special place to be a living memorial and the Red Cross War Memorial Childrens Hospital was born.

Since that time many thousands of children from all walks of life have been comforted, healed and returned home because of a living vision born out of the need to remember those who never came home.

As you can see from the invitation here, you are invited to come along and be part of a special and moving ceremony of Remembrance in the grounds of the Hospital. It will take place round the statue of Peter Pan, the little boy who never dies. Your Chief and Lady President will be laying a wreath on behalf of the Society and all Scots in Southern Africa. The Cape Field Artillery Pipes and Drums will be in attendance and the lament will be played by Pipe Major Andrew Imrie. Little children from the Hospital will also be

guests and will lay flowers in memory of the many children that have died. You are invited to come along, wearing the tartan if you wish, in solidarity with all the guests who remember those that died fighting tyranny and defending freedom, and lay a wreath or flowers in memory of your loved ones.
